Early or Late? The Jewish Calendar is Always Right on Time

People often think that summer is the "slow season" in synagogues but, in fact, we have been working on preparing for the High Holy Days for the past several months! This year, even though the holidays feel very "late" in the secular calendar, meaning that *Erev Rosh HaShanah* does not happen until Sunday, September 29th, and *Kol Nidre/Erev Yom Kippur* takes place on Tuesday, October 8th, they really are "right on time."

When the holidays feel late, it is likely because the Jewish calendar has added a "leap month" in order to compensate for the differences between the Jewish lunar calendar and the Gregorian solar calendar. By way of illustration, 7 out of 19 years a leap month is added, however, the years with an additional month are not quite consecutive.

Rabbi Daniel Goldfarb teaches that: "the Jewish (Metonic) LuniSolar calendar plays against the secular/Gregorian solar calendar like the sea against the beach. The years are like the waves, falling a little ahead or a little behind on an individual basis. The 19-year cycle is like the tide, flowing slowly forward over eleven years and then ebbing backwards for the next eight." For the next two years, the holidays will be earlier, then slip back the third, then forward again and back. "High tide" will happen in 2024 and the 19-year cycle begins again.

However, this discussion is only relevant if we are considering the dates in terms of our secular calendars and our secular lives as, on the Jewish calendar, *Rosh HaShanah* always begins on the 1st of *Tishrei*. Which leads me to ask, how can we help you live more on "Jewish time"?

Do you have a Jewish calendar in your home? (We always have calendars to give out at the New Year ... please just ask starting in mid-September and we'll be happy to give you one.) How about on your phone? Do you know when your Jewish birthday is? There is a wonderful, easy-to-use website, www.HebCal.com, that you can type your birthday into and it will translate any secular date and provide you with the Hebrew calendar date ... and, in addition to being more aware about our how and when to observe our holiday seasons, wouldn't it be great to celebrate your birthday twice! (ReformJudaism.org also has some great information on the Jewish calendar.)

Speaking of items that should be on your calendar, we hope that you will invite your friends to participate in our 8th annual "ShaBaBeQue" and Open House on Friday, August 23rd ... this is a wonderful opportunity to introduce them to our spiritual community and reconnect with opportunities to become more involved at TI. (Special thanks to the Brotherhood and our Chairs, Judy Preefer and Michell Escobar, for making certain this event can be open to everyone so we can share why TI is such a special place to belong.)

At sundown on September 1st, we begin the month of *Elul*, the month before *Rosh HaShanah*, when we start the difficult internal work of preparing for the Days of Awe. May each of us find ways to take control of our calendars such that we can enjoy the beauty of participating meaningfully in Jewish life. Please let me know if you would like to discuss strategies for making your High Holy Days experience more meaningful. As I hope you know, my door is always open.

The Mussar Moment Rabbi Emeritus Howard Shapiro

SIMPLICITY

Conceptually life is simpler in the summer. It is hot and humid in South Florida and so we adjust our life styles to stay out of the midday sun, to enjoy the somewhat cooling breezes closer to the ocean, to reframe our experience of walking from the air-conditioned office/mall/home to our cars as a momentary facial. How good the humidity is for our skin.

In the Mussar world, simplicity is a value added trait. Our tradition reminds us weekly that our inner lives need refreshing and one way to accomplish that is to go back to a simpler life style and live in the mode of Shabbat. I am not talking candles & wine or Torah & prayer. I am talking finding time to get back to essentials and energizing our "selves" by focusing on the simple pleasures like reading, looking around you and centering on what is good and what is full in your life, as opposed to what is missing and lost. I am not talking about Friday sunset to Saturday dusk, although why not?

I had a radical theology professor at Seminary who used to teach that Shabbat is an opportunistic moment, not a fixed period of time. Shabbat can happen anywhere and anytime. Shabbat is that sometimes surprising second when you lift your eyes and see (notice) the shape of the clouds, the color of the hibiscus, the grace and beauty in the sound of laughter. Shabbat is not taking anything for granted, neither the gift of waking up in the morning even with aches and pains nor the blessing of falling asleep at night trusting we will see another day.

The Mussar emphasis on appreciating the simple things in life centering us in the trait of gratitude for what we have as opposed to what we do not is a sensitive approach to living life with love. It is not an instant fix; it is not easy. It takes a click of the mind and an attitude adjustment to rejoice in what is called in our tradition "our portion". The Rabbis teach: "Who is happy (or rich). The one who is satisfied with one's portion."


